What is Bishop Zubik asking us to study?

Challenges

- In the last 10 years, Mass attendance, weddings, infant baptisms, and Catholic elementary school enrollment has declined more than **40%**.
- **50% of our 200 parishes** run annual deficits. Many parishes are rapidly depleting their savings to pay the bills.
- The number of priests in active ministry will decline from **225 to 125** in the next 10 years.

How can we best proclaim the Good News in a Changing World?

What is getting in the way of people coming to know the Lord? What are parishes and schools doing to be centers of evangelization?

On Mission for The Church Alive! involves a comprehensive study of our Church in Southwestern Pennsylvania to understand the challenges and opportunities to get people excited about their faith.

- What are **best practices** from nationwide and among our parishes and schools with respect to evangelization and outreach?
- What can we learn from the more than 40,000 Catholics who participated in one of the most successful philanthropic campaigns in the US Catholic Church?
